ADVOCACY UPDATE

City Council 2024-25 budget

The City Council passed the 2024-25 budget on Wednesday, June 12. We will report more on the impact of the MSD increase and other funding included or removed from the budget affecting downtown businesses. Here are the highlights -

- 1. Increased MSD taxes by additional 70% to .17 per \$100 up from .10 per \$100. This increase is paid by only 41% of downtown property owners.
- 2. Doubled fees for small business outdoor use or dining permits from \$30 to \$60.
- 3. Removed over \$100K in general fund support for Cool Spring Downtown District operations.
- 4. Agreed to provide (1) FTE officer position to the Downtown District.
- 5. Agreed to continue \$60K in funding for the Downtown Ambassador positions managed by the Cool Spring Downtown District

Still on our radar - Reduced street level parking enforcement from 7pm-5pm for consent agenda. The Downtown Alliance was the leader of this initiative since 2019. Your voice mattered.

Businesses have been receiving notices from David Winstead at the City Permitting office. BE SURE TO RENEW OR SUBMIT A NEW OUTDOOR USE OR DINING PERMIT APPLICATION before JUNE 30th. Although the City Council has doubled the fee, you can still submit your application and only pay \$30 for this year if you do it BEFORE JUNE 30th. This is a web address to find the current OUTDOOR USE PERMIT form to fill out if you need one.

Remember You have to attach drawings or photos of your merchandise/dining area and your certificate of insurance. The link on the form is broken at this time. There is no way at the present time to submit the form or renew online. We will report more as information is provided **but it is important for you to make sure that any tables or chairs are represented on your drawing along with your merchandise and any portable signage. If you have any doubt - go to City Hall and ask to speak to David Winstead.**
